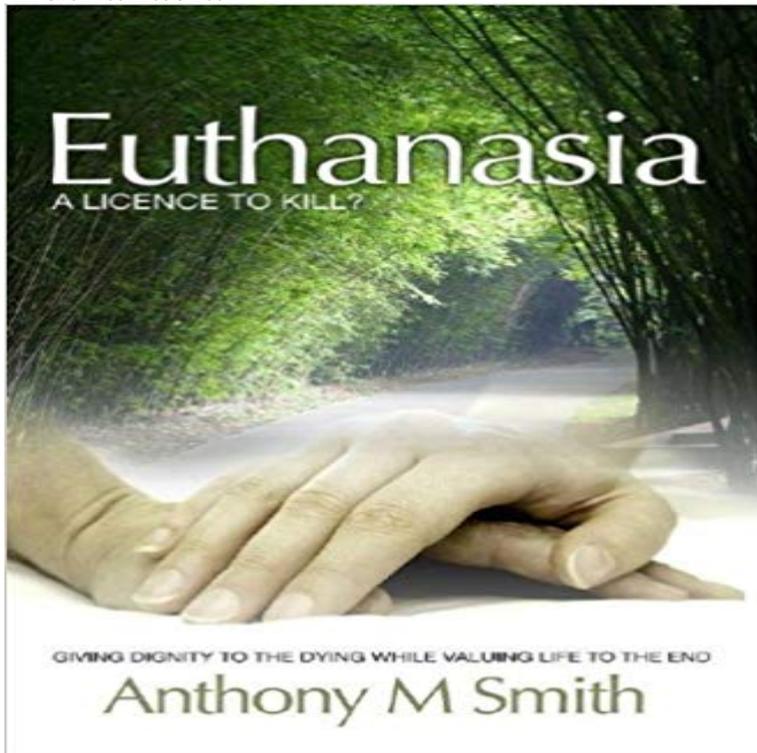


Euthanasia
